Where: Cascade Environmental Education Centre

Overview

A visit to Cascade Environmental Education Centre should be thought of as a learning experience. Students will be learning about many aspects of our Australian environment. Most activities will be completed outside and will involve some walking.

Valuables, Money and Lollies

There are no shops at Cascade and you will not need spending money. Please always consider the environment. Don't bring individually wrapped and over-packaged items for morning tea and lunch on the first day. Bubble gum and chewing gum are not permitted. Valuable items like jewellery and ipads should be left at home. We do not accept responsibility if these items are brought and are either lost, broken or stolen. The centre requests that the following non-sustainably produced items are not be brought to camp: poppers, lollies, aerosol spray insect repellent, computer games, ipads etc. A camera may be taken at your own risk.

The full excursion cost of \$150 is due by Wednesday 17th March and online POP payments are preferred. If you are experiencing difficulties paying by this date, please contact the principal.

Eating

Students are required to bring their own morning tea and lunch on Day One of camp.

Students may be required to assist with food preparation or cleaning up.

Sleeping

Males and females sleep in separate dormitories or tents and an adult sleeps in an adjoining room. There are double bunks and students must bring a sleeping bag and a pillow slip.

Behaviour expectations

Student attendance on this excursion will depend on satisfactory behaviour displayed at school and attendance at the excursion will be at the discretion of the Principal. Behaviour that is non-compliant or dangerous will result in carers being contacted and asked to collect their child.
