Nutrition Survey - tomorrow

Follow up to the National Nutrition and Physical Activity Surveys of Schoolchildren conducted in 2000 and 2006 - Tuesday, November 13th.

All students in Years 2-6 at Bellingen Primary School will be invited to participate in an anonymous survey about eating patterns, nutrition knowledge, sport, social networks and physical activity on November 13th.

The survey has been conducted at Bellingen Primary School in 2000 and 2006 and we are now repeating the study in 2012 at the same schools from every state and territory of Australia to compare the results and see if anything has changed over 12 years. This is an anonymous survey, that takes approximately 15-20 minutes and your child will not be asked to put his/her name on anything. The child's answers will be kept private and confidential. He/she may also decide not to do the survey on the day of the study and he/she will be able to refuse if he/she wishes to do so. Your child can also decide whether or not he/she wants to participate in the height/weight measurement, as this is also optional.

If you permit your child to complete the survey, please fill out the consent form and submit it to the school office.
