YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP

Congratulations to Ella Sheather-Dean (pictured), who was presented with a Youth Scholarship this week. Ella plans to purchase a laptop computer and stationery to support her HSC and traineeship opportunities.

The Youth Scholarship Program assists eligible young people living in social housing or on the NSW Housing Register to complete their HSC or TAFE equivalent. Two hundred and sixty six scholarships were on offer, each one consists of a one off payment of \$2,000 which is administrated by the school or TAFE College on behalf of the student.

Our school is celebrating NAIDOC today with students experiencing traditional dance, art and sports. The day will be an exciting and memorable celebration of Aboriginal culture. In anticipation of the day, I thank the community and the Bellingen High School Cultural Consciousness team for their efforts.

UNIFORM

I think it timely that I remind everyone of the 'no hoodie' rule at our school. Whilst I know it has been cold, our uniform policy does not include hooded jumpers, nor should students be wearing them at school. Our uniform code includes a school jumper with a logo; however, you may wish to purchase a dark blue jumper (without writing or hood) from



a supplier of your choice. If it is financially unviable for you to provide a school jumper for your son or daughter, I will assist them to acquire one from the school uniform shop. If your child comes to school out of uniform, please provide them with an explanatory note which they will need to take to the Uniform Coordinator – outside the Deputy Principal's Office - for a red slip; however, hooded jumpers are not negotiable.

The big Community of Schools extravaganza will take place next Tuesday 28th in our MPC. The night starts at 5pm and will feature performance items from across the schools in the Dorrigo- Bellinger Valley. It will be a great night and only a gold coin donation to enjoy the show!

The Camp Creative Committee has allocated scholarships to our school again this year. Students are free to apply for any course that is appropriate to their age and skill level. INFECTIOUS DISEASES LETTER

Last week I issued to all students a letter outlining the need for families to inform the school if anyone is suffering, or suspected of suffering, an infectious disease. The reason for that letter to you is that we have a student suffering Hodgkin's lymphoma and that student needs to be protected from the risk of infection. Given the major problem we have with whooping cough in the North Coast and the lower than national average vaccination rate in our region, this is a real concern. A copy of that letter follows:

Dear Parent/Guardian,

We wish to advise you that a student in our school community is currently receiving medical treatment for cancer. This student will be attending school on occasion while recovering from/undergoing treatment.

As a consequence of treatment, this student's ongoing health is at risk if he/she comes into contact with infectious illnesses, in particular: chicken pox, whooping cough, measles or mumps. If your son/daughter is suspected of having one of these illnesses it is very important that he/she does not attend school. It is also important that while your child is unwell he/she remains at home until he/she is no longer contagious. Information on infectious conditions can be found on national health websites e.g. www.health.gov.au or alternatively contact your local GP.

If your child has chicken pox, whooping cough, measles or mumps or is suspected of having an illness please contact the school immediately. This will allow the school to assess the probable contact and therefore exposure of our student to the disease. Notification can then be given to the parents of medical specialists.

As a school community we value your support in relation to the well-being of all of our students. Please do not hesitate to contact the school if you have any questions.

Applications for the 2016 Youth Scholarship Program are now open. The Scholarship Program aims to assist eligible young people living in *social housing (public housing, Aboriginal housing, Community housing) or on the NSW Housing Register (waiting list) or living in crisis accommodation.*

Successful applicants completing the Higher School Certificate (HSC) or TAFE equivalent will receive a one-off payment of \$1,500 to be spent on education related expenses. (This has changed from the \$2000 awarded to the 2015 recipients, but Housing NSW is presenting a greater number of Awards in 2016 within each District).

Bellinghen with just a little fortune, managed to score the winner with mere seconds on the clock.

The third round saw us matched against local rivals Orara High School, a team we have faced a number of times who up until now have been our nemesis. Again in a very tight game the teamwork of the Bellinghen side was to prove the undoing of Orara.

The fourth round took us further afield with a game against Camden Haven. This was to be the tightest of all our games, with the scores level at full time and again at extra time.
