2021 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened on Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now apply online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should re-apply or update their details.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.



Education Public Schools Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to reapply.

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2020 to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address. Note: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Tell Them From Me Parent Survey

During the first two weeks of term 4, we will be taking part in the *Tell Them From Me* survey for students, teachers and **parents**.

High participation rates in the Tell Them From Me **parent survey** helps schools reliably identify areas of strength and areas for improvement from the perspective of parents, and helps inform practical changes where needed.

What do I need to do to participate in the survey?

The survey typically takes 15 minutes and is conducted entirely online through a secure website operated by the survey developers, The Learning Bar. You can complete the surveys on desktop computers, laptops, ipads, tablets and smartphones. Use the link above to complete the survey at home. **The survey closes 25th October.**

Will the school be able to identify me or my child from my responses?

Survey responses are anonymous so staff in schools will not be able to identify individual parents or students from parent responses. Data suppression rules are applied to the school reporting tools where there are fewer than five responses. In other words, schools only see responses to questions which have been answered by five or more parents.

What sort of analysis will be done of the survey data?

School leaders can use the data to better understand the experiences and views of parents at their school. CESE will undertake state-wide analysis of the survey data in conjunction with existing student data held by the department, including performance data. The results will help all schools better understand the relationship between parents and students' engagement, students' wellbeing, effective teaching and student learning. Results from CESE's analysis of this data will also help teachers and principals discuss what works to improve student outcomes. This supports the department's continuing focus on quality teaching and leadership. The data will be retained for future analysis to help us better understand the nature of student engagement and wellbeing over time.

Stage 1 CAPA News - Music

In CAPA Music students investigated the potential sounds of found materials and created "tuneful trash" musical instruments.

They had fun learning about all the many types of materials that musical instruments are made from.

Students discovered that physical movements such as scraping, bowing, striking, blowing and shaking produce sound.

Students had the opportunity to play their "tuneful trash" when they composed their own soundscapes rehearsing together to create a piece of music, not just sound effects. They also explored the musical concept of dynamics as a way of enhancing their piece.

The Music Component of the Creative Arts Program (CAPA) at our school for Stage 2 Students includes a 4 Week Block of music activities for each class.

We have developed our knowledge of 'rhythms' and have listened for them, found them in every conversation and word we say, read them, played them and even written them down with true music notation.

We used Native American Music as our platform as it presents with strong and wholesome beats and rhythms and the subject matter of the songs complimented the Stage 2 unit on 'Sustainability' The music of these peoples is about their connection, care and respect of their beautiful environment, Mother Earth.

In Drama this semester we have been having so much fun learning about dramatic elements and skills in Playbuilding and Improvisation.
