


This term we are learning about day and night and seasons in science.

# Lessons clashing with School Activities

It is a difficult decision when Gala Sporting Days or District Swimming, occurs on the same day as your child's music lesson. (?)

## Solutions;

1. Call your instrumental teacher and tell them there is a clash. With 2 days notice, they can often find a time to reschedule the lesson. This may come in the form of a double lesson in the next week, or a floating lesson that can fit in a time slot when another student is away during the term.

Teachers all try hard to accommodate students and family needs eg illness, appointments, floods, and Gala Days,

however, you must let them know with the most ideal time being 48 hours.

Please also be mindful that asking to shuffle a lesson time also affects the student that shifts to accommodate your child. There is a further ripple effect to classroom teachers, being unsure of where their students are. Thus-

- 2. Let your classroom teacher know of any change.
- 3. Our Instrumental teachers have students at other schools in the wider community and may not have potential to make up lessons when every day is filled at a different school. In this case you may have to forfeit the lesson if you make a choice to be somewhere else. They do however want the consistency of learning and are very diligent.  $\odot$
- 4. If you make no attempt to let them know and they find your child is away from school for any reason and have not been informed then they should and will charge for the lesson.

I believe this is highly reasonable. We all know how frustrating it is to sit and wait for nobody! (especially when they were the first, early morning student) (2)

I hope this gives the clear message that it is up to you to communicate and negotiate where possible. We want your child to succeed and be happy.


