Thursday and Friday saw students K-6 strengthening their problem solving and team work skills by participating in the highly engaging World of Maths.



We will be in our school uniform for the performances so the crowds can match up the extremely beautiful playing with our School!



- 1 cup baby spinach leaves, chopped
- 1 cup wholemeal self-raising flour

6 eggs, beaten

1 cup reduced-fat tasty cheese, grated



Preheat oven to 180°C. Line a 12-hole muffin

Heat a non-stick frypan over medium heat and

cook the onion until translucent. Allow to cool.

Place all ingredients into a large mixing bowl


