Level 4 Restrictions currently in all schools

 Parents and carers in areas under stay-athome rules must keep children – across primary and secondary school – at home unless they need to be at school. Schools and outside of school hours care (OOSH) services are open for any child that needs it.

- Schools will have minimal supervision on site for those students who cannot be educated at home, if their parent or carer is an essential worker.
- All non-core curriculum related activities are to cease on school site.
- Students must not attend work or school if unwell, even with mild symptoms of COVID-19. Any person with any COVID-19 symptoms must be sent home and not return to school unless:
- they have isolated for 10 days, when no medical certificate is available
- they have a negative COVID-19 test result and are symptom free.

In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms, a letter from their GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test. Anyone who is unwell with COVID-19 symptoms is strongly encouraged to get tested and self-isolate until a negative result is received. Find your local testing clinics.

- Attendance if your child is engaged in the learning from, either via the packs or online then they will be marked as 'f' flexible. If they are not engaged at all then they will be marked as absent. Teachers will be doing regular check ins with students.
- Canteens and uniform stores are not to operate.
- Bubblers will be locked or water turned off. All students who need to attend will need to bring a water bottle.

Check out these cool native birds we did, which were inspired by Pete Cromer's artistic work. We used watercolour paints!






English/History
