MONDAY 6TH JUNE- Best practice road safety education with NRMA

The NRMA Science and Road Safety program is delivered **free** of charge to schools in Sydney, ACT and regional NSW.

This best practice road safety education focusses on increasing the knowledge and skills of students, teachers and parents. The program is mapped to the <u>NSW K-6 PDHPE</u>, <u>English and Science Syllabi</u>.

The Roadshow will explicitly teach the **WHAT, WHY and HOW** of road safety for our students; increase children's knowledge to drive changes in their attitudes and behaviours towards road safety; educate parents so they know how to keep their children safe and provide to teachers with resources.

This is our third attempt to host the Roadshow due to Covid! What a fantastic opportunity for our students.

There will be 4 shows with Kindergarten having their own session. Students who own bike or scooter helmets can bring them along on the day as helmets feature in the presentation. Please label with their name.

Close Contacts Attending School

On 20 April the NSW Premier announced that from 6pm 22 April 2022, close contacts (including household contacts) would be able to leave isolation with certain exemptions in place.

The announcement means that from the beginning of Term 2, students and staff who are identified as close contacts will be able to attend school following certain guidelines.

Visitors on school sites

Schools and early childhood education and care (ECEC) services can invite visitors to their sites regardless of their vaccination status, in line with settings in the broader community.

Workers and volunteers must meet double vaccination requirements including:

- volunteers or staff operating uniform shops and canteens
- visitors supporting school operations and curriculum delivery
- allied health partners for the wellbeing of students
- university and TAFE students coming on school sites to complete their practicum or teacher training.

Visitors including volunteers, allied health partners and staff providing professional learning who are close contacts should conduct a daily RAT and return a negative result before attending a school or ECE site.



They must also wear a mask indoors at all times (except when eating or exercising)

Visitors are also required to advise the school that they are a close contact if they are interacting with students before they come on site.
