Thanks to Kristy Glyde for taking this on and doing an enormous amount of work. Thanks also to Kristy Livingstone and Dylan Harry. A definite positive that kids could participate without doing the fundraising aspects. Possibly do it once every 2 years (biannually).	
4. Sustainability Sub- Committee	Lots of ideas. A grant has opened this month worth \$15,000. Michelle and others visited Crossmaglen PS as part of a school sustainability party – their GA gave a tour. Native bee hive is one current proposal. We used to have one at the school and the poles are still there – possibility the hive in the high school could be split. Bee keepers within the school community could help. Dylan prepared to assist with funding a hive with or without the grant. Other ideas: Bushtucker Garden, Uncle Mark Flanders could come and talk about the significance of bush tucker, outside classroom (good for support staff to take students to for chill out time. Other idea is a waste audit – what's the existing system – probably with another grant – new bins – worm farms – need to have conversations with Liz Scott and Miss Viv.
